

BYE-LAWS FOR BRANCHES OF THE SOCIETY ABROAD.

THE foreign membership of the Society is steadily increasing, and the Council, in its desire to place its advantages at the disposal of all members, has adopted the following Bye-laws in order to encourage the closer association of groups of members abroad.

Proposed Bye-laws for Governance of Sections Abroad.

(1) The Council may at its discretion, upon receipt of a request from a sufficient number of Members, Collective and Ordinary, resident abroad in any country, create a Section or Branch of the Society for that country, and it shall also have power to dissolve such a section at any time after it has been formed.

(2) Such Sections as are referred to in (1) shall be managed by a Sectional or Branch Council or Committee elected by the Members of the Section.

(3) The Council or Committee of the Section shall prepare rules for the government of the Section, and these rules shall be submitted to the Council of the Society for approval.

(4) A certain sum, to be fixed from time to time, based on the cost of printing and distribution of notices of meetings, stationery, and incidental expenses, shall be put at the disposal of the Section or Branch. Beyond this amount, the Section shall not be a charge on the Society nor shall the Society be responsible for liabilities incurred by the Section.

(5) Complete reports of each Meeting held by a Section or Branch shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Society, and these reports shall form the basis of a report in the Proceedings of the Society.

(6) Each Section or Branch shall appoint a small Publications Committee to examine all papers contributed and reports of discussions held at the Sectional Meetings, and the Publications Committee shall then forward to the Secretary of the Society all such papers as are deemed worthy of publication.
